SOMETHING TO PONDER BY REV BRITT

Our annual Advent season is about to begin. In our church services we will light the candles on the Advent wreath and count the weeks until Christmas day. The candlelight representing gifts of hope, peace, joy and love will spiral up in our prayers and preparations as a blessing.

And yet, perhaps you, like me, have a sense of, well, duller expectations this year? Given the trauma and tensions in the world around us, given the way the earth is aching for a bit of good snow right now so that it can properly rest, the idea of Christmas itself seems a bit far away.

It's the mood of the season, I am talking about I suppose, more than anything. Is it possible to announce hope, peace, joy and love when their evidence is less abundant? Is it the reality we are pointing to in Advent, or the faithful expectation that in God these things have real substance, real presence, in human life?

This morning the sun shining through the balcony window is brilliant and warm on my face. A blessing. My son made me breakfast tortillas - I can say I was tickled and nicely surprised. My old dog who is mostly blind still tries to bet me to throw her chew stick around the living room. Such small goodnesses are sustaining blessing in the ordinary cycles of the everyday world.

But then there comes a time for something more powerful to break through. Something to reach across the great distance of the world's disconnect from hope, peace, joy and love. Something to reach through our sense of mood or expectation. Something that is independent of these things and can transcend them.

What Advent brings us is the opportunity to hear the message, "He comes." We don't create this coming nor do we inspire it by our disposition. Rather, the One Who Comes is coming now and soon, however we may be within ourselves. As the weeks of Advent pass we become more attuned to the meaning of the message. He comes. As he came once long ago in a humble birth, and he comes again, now. His coming is sure, certain even. We have but to wait and watch as we are, and Christ will surely arrive in time for us to celebrate his birth and welcome him in.

May yours be a slow and blessed Advent this year and may you find yourself warming up to his coming as the time approaches.

TEA & BAKE SALE SUCCESS!



FINANCE CORNER - Update as of October 2023

Primarily due to ongoing inflationary pressures, Salisbury's deficit after the first 10 months of 2023 increased to -\$31,700. Though income was \$12,300 above budget, repair and maintenance expenses exceeded budget by about \$21,800,

including one-time expenses such as the church lighting project and the fire alarm system upgrade.

Last year at this time our deficit totalled -\$18,500. We went on to finish 2022 with a surplus of +7,300 -a turnaround of \$25,800!

Our financial challenge is considerably larger this year. With just two months to go, we all need to pitch in if we're going to finish the year in the black. Judging by the way we rallied last year, we can do it. Thanks for doing your part!
