Jesus said, "In time, God will gather all people together and will separate them like a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.

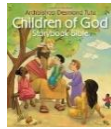
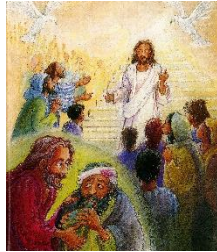

### **Prayer Before Sharing**

God is with us.  
Thanks be to God.  
Let us meet together at God's own table.  
Summoned by God, we come with longing and hopeful hearts.

God of Life,  
You are always with your people in all times and places.  
Whether we are stumbling or surefooted, you are there at our side.  
It has always been this way, down through the corridors of time,  
even when we have wandered far from you.  
Sometimes we get lost in our own anger,  
fear or pain and can't find you.  
Life becomes a maze and we are not always able  
to see or think clearly.  
Sometimes we suffer in mind, as well as body and spirit.  
We cannot see our way free to breathe deeply the breath of life.  
Even so we come now to this table,  
breaking bread and remembering the actions and words of Jesus.

In the closing days of his life,  
Jesus met with his friends and followers,  
sharing one last meal with them.  
During that last supper, Jesus took bread,  
broke it and shared it with them, saying:  
"Take, eat, remember me."

Likewise, he took a cup, filled it with wine  
and passed it over to them, saying:  
"Take, drink, remember me."

By these words and actions Jesus proclaimed his love  
for all those broken and weary and tossed about in creation.  
By our words and actions today,  
we join the broken and weary and tossed about of this age.  
We place ourselves at Jesus' table of broken  
and outpoured love with them.  
As we break this bread, as we lift this outpoured cup,  
we participate in Jesus' life of sacrificial love,  
a life opposed but never overcome  
by the powers and principalities of the world.



It is because of his life of love that we now pray:

Send down your Holy Spirit on us now,  
and on this broken bread and this empowering cup.  
Make a resurrection for us and all of creation,  
so that in and through these broken things  
we find confirmation in ourselves once again  
that love is stronger than fear,  
hope better than anger,  
open-hearted sacrifice better than hate.  
In the sharing,  
let us together become a living sign  
of your eternal presence,  
a presence that we can now grasp firmly  
with fragile human hands.  
And may we continue to meet together at Christ's table,  
until times runs out  
and all things in creation are made new.  
Amen.
